- **Watch a longer video** about the Prodigal Son
- or just the pretty song from it
- and another fun video from the fifties: Little Toot!
- Play Where To?? Each player writes down on a piece of paper:
 - where they would most like to visit
 - with whom
 - one thing that they would be sure to take
 - how they would travel there.

Players take turns youngest to oldest, guessing answers of the person next to them. As soon as player misses an answer, play moves on to the next person. Person who guesses the most correct answers gets a spiffy prize, like first dibs on Delia's Welcome Home Cookies, below.

Make Delia's "Welcome Home" cookies:

- Boil down 1 cup raisins + 2 cups water until there is only 2 cups total
- 🯶 Smash together (or cream in mixer) 1½ cup Crisco + 2/3 cup sugar + 1 egg
- Add into creamed mixture 2 cups flour + 1 teaspoon cinnamon + 1 teaspoon baking soda + ½ teaspoon salt +1/4 teaspoon cloves + 1 teaspoon nutmeg + 1 teaspoon all spice.
- Dump in boiled down raisins with water. Mix all together.
- Pour mix into ungreased jelly roll pan (13 inches x 9 inches) and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
- Frost with a mix of 2 Tablespoons lemon juice + ½ cup confectioners' sugar.
- Cut into squares while still warm. MMMM. Serve to your favorite wanderers. Worth coming home for.
- Spend some time at the table: Has anyone at the table ever run away and made a new start? Has anyone in your family ever run away to do a new job or make a fresh start? In olden times, sons and daughters learned to do the jobs of their mothers and fathers, in other words, the farmers' kids learned to be farmers, the bakers' kids learned to be bakers, and so on. This was simply necessary so that skills could be passed on in ages where and when there was little schooling. How would you feel about doing what your parents do to earn a living? Would you feel the same if you had no choice?






