QUESTIONS TO PONDER (YOUNGERS):


- Just imagine being a rock. What would you feel like? Look like? Where would you like to be?
- In your rockiness, how would you get around?
- So what are the really good things about being a rock?
- Do you have any of those good things about you?
- Has anyone taught you those things?

QUESTIONS TO PONDER (OLDERS):

- Do you have people who act as rocks for you in your life?
 - Are you a rock for someone else?
- Do you need to have both the characteristics of a mother AND a father?
- Is there a difference?
- What are the spiritual stones that make you who you are?
- Are there any characteristics that you need to work on?

THINGS TO DO:

What kind of room do you think God has prepared for you in heaven? What would you like it to look like? Can you draw a picture here? Don't forget that your room is built on a foundation of rocks. Name the rocks that support your room:







- Watch another <u>Easter video with kids</u>
- * And listen to a song about Our Father's House because it's ... ELVIS!
- Tell someone that THEY are your rock. Find a nice rock. Perhaps you would like to decorate it like a mouse a snail or a rabbit. Maybe it would look nice with just some colors or flowers. Maybe you could wet it and polish it. Turn it over and write on it, "You Are My Rock". Leave it someplace where your special person can find it.
- Or decorate a rock with one of these great ideas
- ** Carry a rock prayer every day in your pocket. Think of someone who might need your prayers. Or if there is someone in your life for whom you are really thankful, you could make a rock for them, too! Find a small rock. Put their name on it, either in your imagination or with a marker. Carry the rock in your pocket all day. When you think about their name, think your "rock strength" to them. At bedtime, put it by your bed, or on a windowsill, or just in a nice place. Let God watch over them overnight.
- **Build a cairn**. A small pile of rocks is called a cairn, especially when it is left as a memorial or landmark. Perhaps you would like to build one of these. You could add a rock for each day that you are inside. Or you could build it of the rock prayers you have carried in your pocket this week. You could make it to balance each rock could be something you really want to do, or are waiting for, or need to work on, or make a pile of all the people that you love!

- Spend some time at the table: Ask everyone at the table to share what they think is the most important thing they have learned from their father? Their mother? (Things like "don't stick straws up your nose" don't count!)
- Play a Rock-Paper-Scissors grace at dinner this week. If Rock wins, the winner must name a strength that they have or are working on. If Paper wins, the winner must name someone for whom they are praying or thankful. If Scissors wins, the winner may carve out a little extra helping from one of the foods on the table. (This would be a good game to play with dessert on the table!)




AND For Our Wyoming Friends: ABRAHAM. OUT OF ONE, MANY




